

How the name **Jørgen** or **George** was used for 400 years in our family

The first son was normally named after the father's father and the second after the mother's father. The first daughter was normally named after the mother's mother and the second after the father's mother. This standard procedure was followed, unless a family member had died recently; if so the child was named after the late person

The **red colour** shows the descendants after Jørgen Lauridsen

Jørgen Lauridsen (1537 - 1602) Vicar in Udby Anna Hansdatter	The first known person named Jørgen . He is probably named after one of his grandfathers.
Bertel Iversen (1555 - 1626) Vicar in Taulov, near Kolding Ellen Jørgensdatter (1570 -)	Ellen has her fathers name as surname.
Jørgen Bertelsen Taulov (1606 - 1680) Professor in Odense Margrethe Jeramiasdatter Wulf (- 1656)	Jørgen got his name from his mother's father, because he is the second son, or because the grandfather died a few years earlier.
Jørgen Hahn (1647 - 1699) City and District Doctor Odense Anna Cathrine Taulov (- 1683)	This Jørgen is named after his grandfather Jørgen Mule
Jørgen Hahn (1677 - 1730) Alderman in Odense Martinette Brochmann (1675 - 1730)	Jørgen got his name from his mother's father, because he is the second son, the first son was named Herman.
Wilhelm Hahn (1707 - 1802) Chancellor and District Doctor in Maribo Ingeborg Karstin (1713 - 1789)	Wilhelm is named after his mother's father because he is the second son, the first was named Jørgen after Jørgen Hahn (1647-1699)
Georg Hahn (1744 - 1801) Vicar in Kjøbelev Birgitte Cathrine Leth (1747 - 1799)	Georg was first named Jørgen after his father's father, but he Latinised his name to Georgius and later to Georg
Gregers Sørensen (1773 - 1844) Farmer Ingeborg Martinette Hahn (1773 -)	
Georg Sørensen (1802 - 1842) Miller Johanne Jeanette Marthinsen (1808 - 1875) Skelby	Georg got his name from his mother's father, because he died the year before.
Rasmus Hansen (1825 - 1895) Miller Martinette Lisette Sørensen (1834 - 1912)	
Georg Jens Michael Hansen (1869 - 1941) Farmer Anna Kirstine Larsen 1872 - 1945	Georg got his name from his mother's father, because he is the second son.
Eyner Hansen (1899 - 1976)	
Elsie Moss (1909 - 1994)	
George Eyner Hansen (1926 - 1930)	George got his name from his father's father because he is the first son. The second son is named William after his mother's father
